## Subject: RE



### Statement of

#### Intent:

At KS3 the primary purpose of Catholic Religious education is to come to know and understand God's revelation which is fulfilled in the person of Jesus Christ. Religious Education helps the pupil to know and experience the meaning of this revelation in his or her own life and the life of the community which is the Church. Because RE is central to the curriculum of the Catholic school and it is at the heart of the philosophy of Catholic education, we believe that RE is a subject for **all** pupils, whatever their own family background and personal beliefs and/or practices. We aim to convey how Religious Education plays an important role in preparing pupils for their future, employment, and lifelong learning. We ensure this by creating an engaging and diverse curriculum that is in line with the Catholic Curriculum Directory.

Religious Education-at St Paul's teaches about the faith in line with the Gospel teachings, and invites the individual to respond to the message of Christ. As the individual responds to this invitation, growth in faith and knowledge helps the pupils to respond to the call to holiness and understand the fullness of what it is to be human.

The RE department enacts this by allowing pupils to develop religious literacy; to acquire and develop knowledge and understanding of Christianity and the other principal religions and world views represented in the United Kingdom; to develop an understanding of the influence of the beliefs, values and traditions on individuals, communities, societies and cultures; to develop attitudes of respect towards other people who hold views and beliefs different from their own; to develop the ability to make reasoned and informed judgements about religious issues, with reference to the principal religions and world views represented locally and in the United Kingdom.

RE is regarded as an academic discipline with the same systematic demands and the same rigour as the other disciplines. Our intent as a Department is to ensure that RE be the key element in an inter-disciplinary dialogue amongst subjects. We are concerned with not only intellectual knowledge but also with emotional and effective learning. We are aware that without religious education, pupils would be deprived of an essential element of their formation and personal development which helps them attain a vital harmony between faith and culture. The content of Religious Education will help the pupil make a critique of all other knowledge, leading, for example, to an understanding of the relationship between science and religion or history, and between theology, sport and the human body.

We believe that religious education offers a space where by reflecting on their own beliefs, values and experiences in the light of their study, pupils can grow intellectually and spiritually alike.

#### Statement of Implication:

The schemes of work at KS3 are mapped to the Diocesan Curriculum Directory, which ensure that all required strands are taught from Yr7 right through to Yr9. All KS3 class teachers know how the lessons are linked to the RCCD. We carry out shared planning and have a bountiful shared area which means there is a consistent approach to teaching within the Department. We ensure that pupils know and understand the fundamental concepts of Catholic Christianity and other religions and worldviews that are prevalent in society through classwork, discussions, research, monitoring progress and assessments. Embedding religious literacy, which is the knowledge of, and ability to understand, religion, beliefs, practices, spiritual insights and secular world views is implemented through teacher input and assessment. Pupils are enabled to visit places of worship by planning visits to religious buildings of other faiths.

We promote pupil's curiosity in lessons by encouraging them to share their own beliefs and express ideas and insights about the nature, significance, and impact of religion and worldviews on their beliefs. This is implemented by combining information about religious and non-religious worldviews with the skills required to express insights into their nature, significance and impact.

Progression is ensured by designing, monitoring and updating our curriculum which increases the range, accuracy, and sophistication of skills required, as well as advancing the pupils' ability to apply their knowledge and understanding to enquiries. At KS3 expected progress is monitored through assessments which happen in the form of their Class Assessed Task (CAT) which is a task that allows students to be resourceful in their completion. There is one of these per unit of study where the teacher awards a grade and a skill for development which students then focus on in prep for their next CAT. At the end of each unit of study is a subject knowledge test which tests basic subject re-call of key terminology and also some scaffolded GCSE 'skill type' questions which allow for students to start to develop an awareness of GCSE skills. These type questions allow for students to be able to develop their writing skills.

There is a big focus on key terminology/key words and interleaving and this is an integral part of what lessons look like in RE. Homework is set using a HW Booklet which comprises of questions per unit of study that is set on a bi-weekly basis to consolidate knowledge outside of lessons. This is monitored by class teacher and KS3 co-ordinator.

**The curriculum in each year group builds on previous skills and learning to fully embed them, ready for KS4 – we strive to make RE engaging and enjoyable and promote the love of learning.**
