Statement of Intent:

The aim of KS5 RE is to explore a range of key theories linked to Philosophy, Ethics and Christianity. This will then enable them to understand what their affinities are for future studies as all three components link to world views and the history of thought. Students will leave with cultural capital that will ensure they are competent in any field of life.

Students are encouraged to ask questions in order to expand their worldview and be able to think critically. We intend to fuel their curiosity in order to allow them to develop a hunger for knowledge and understanding of social, cultural, political and religious topics which they will encounter in the real world.

Statement of Implementation

Lessons are taught by very well experienced teachers who are specialists in their subject areas. A number of different strategies are used in order for students to be able to develop the skills and knowledge required to be able to be successful by the end of the course.

These include in-depth exploration of specific key theorists, followed by debates where students come to their own conclusions which are well supported with appraised evidence. We emphasise the importance of students speaking and writing using academic language in order to promote religious literacy in order to prepare them best for future academic endeavours.

Lessons always incorporate scholarly quotes which are essential when complying with essay requirements under exam conditions. Teachers always encourage students to support their in-class learning with additional independent reading around the topic, outside of lessons.

Re-visiting content and interleaving is an integral part of how the themes are delivered across all components, which ensures content is fully embedded by the time they are formally examined in the subject.

Feedback, whether it be oral or written, is a key feature of every lesson for every student. This allows teachers to assess student's ability and plan for sustained rapid progress based on individual student needs. Homework compliments this.
